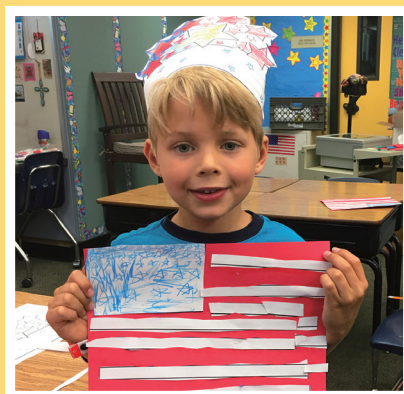

REGISTRATION

- Registration deadline is May 18, 2018
- Enrollment during registration is on a first-come first-served basis
- Classes close when they reach maximum enrollment of 18 students
- Students may enroll in 1-5 courses per session
- New material will be covered in each session. Students may register for the same courses or choose different courses each session.

- Late Fees: \$5.00 plus \$1 per minute after closing

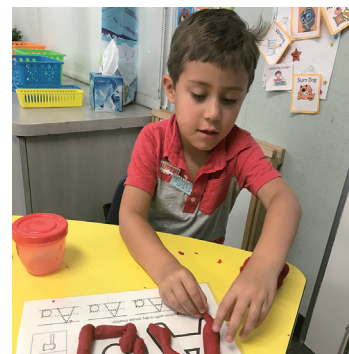


Schedule of Classes

Kindergarten Readiness (Grades K-2) Ms. Heidi Sicka

Periods 1-3: 8:00 am- 11:15 am . Sessions 1 & 2

Kindergarten Readiness Program will provide students with the opportunity to receive support in making the transition from preschool to Kindergarten. Throughout this course, the students will participate in activities that will help foster the academic skills necessary for a successful experience in Kindergarten. The key components that will be focused on are social development, phonological awareness, print knowledge, mathematics, and science. This course also provides the students with opportunities to get accustomed to the Kindergarten routines and expectations.



Music and Movement (Grades K-1) Ms. Heidi Sicka

Period 4: 12:00 pm – 1:00 pm . Sessions 1 & 2

This is a fun and interactive class that will engage children through songs, stories, and movements as it ignites all of their developmental and academic skills. The body and mind will work together as children learn about rhythm, cause and effect, body awareness, and coordination among many other developmental skills that will enhance their abilities.

Science with a Bang! (Grades K-2) Ms. Heidi Sicka

Period 5: 1:00 pm – 2:00 pm . Sessions 1 & 2

To learn about the world in which they live, children must be given the opportunities to discover the physical properties of objects around them. Our young scientists will be motivated to explore their environment and encouraged to ask how and why things happen while engaging in the process of science. Scientist will learn about science safety, key words, and the concept of the day such as air, water, gadgets, and concoctions with take-home projects and daily experiments. Each day, scientists will record their experiences in a journal that will go home with them at the end of the session.

Math Proficiency (Grade 1) Ms. Carrie Levin

Period 1: 8:00 am- 9:00 am . Sessions 1 & 2

This proficiency course will focus on the academic skills within the subject of math. The students will focus on place, value, learning strategies of addition and subtraction (sharpening their basic facts skills!), introduction to word problems, and many more topics. This course will be a great chance to review concepts and get a little jumpstart on their new grade level work!



Language Arts Proficiency (Grade 1) Ms. Carrie Levin

Period 2: 9:00 am- 10:00 am . Sessions 1 & 2

This proficiency course will focus on the academic skills within the subject of language arts. The students will work on their reading skills, phonics, reading comprehension, and creative writing. This course will be a great chance to sharpen their skills, review concepts, and get a little jumpstart on their new grade level work!



iPad Integration (Grades 1-3) Ms. Carrie Levin

Period 3: 10:15 am – 11:15 am . Sessions 1 & 2

In this course the children will use Math and Reading based apps to improve Math Fact Fluency, Reading Fluency, and to be introduced to new concepts they have not yet seen, while reviewing those they have. These curriculum-based apps will help the children have a hands-on learning experience, so they can be introduced to Math and Language Arts in an interactive way to spark interest and build their skills. This is a great way for the children to build confidence with these important subjects, while still having a blast learning.

Plots, Props, and Performance! (Grades 1-3) Ms. Carrie Levin

Period 4: 12:00 pm – 1:00 pm . Sessions 1 & 2

This course will provide students the opportunity to improve reading fluency and comprehension through dramatic presentation of written work in script form. Readers Theater will help the children to explore reading through their voice, imagination, facial expressions, and creativity. They will bring the stories to life through body movement, prop building and costume making (both with paper and arts and crafts materials). Readers Theater Scripts are adapted from grade level books and other sources, giving the students essential practice in oral reading fluency and public speaking. The scripts also provide an opportunity for group interaction and student cooperation. Come and let your acting bug shine in this very interactive Readers Theater course.



Creative Cultures (Grades K-3) Ms. Carrie Levin

Period 5: 1:00 pm – 2:00 pm . Sessions 1 & 2

Children in this course will get to experience the magic, stories, traditions, art and science of many different cultures. Through many different modalities including art, cooking, storybooks, and science, the children will learn about the many different cultures of our world. We will “travel” together around the world to dive into the lives and traditions of the many different cultures to experience how diverse and amazing all of God’s people are.

Second Grade Math (Grade 2) Mrs. Maria Contreras

Period 1: 8:00 am- 9:00 am . Sessions 1 & 2

Through hands on and different games and activities students will review important key concepts and will receive and introduction to second grade math. Students will focus on reinforcing math facts along with addition and subtraction strategies. We will explore place value, time, and money.

Second Grade Language Arts (Grade 2) Mrs. Maria Contreras

Period 2: 9:00 am- 10:00 am . Sessions 1 & 2

Students will review and reinforce key skills to jumpstart second grade. We will focus on writing, language, phonics, and reading comprehension.

Meet the Author (Grades 1-3) Mrs. Maria Contreras

Period 3: 10:15 am – 11:15 am . Sessions 1 & 2

Students will use their creative writing skills to write their own story books. They will practice the writing process and eventually “publish” their books.





Once Upon a Time (Grades 1-3) Mrs. Maria Contreras

Period 4: 12:00 pm – 1:00 pm . Sessions 1 & 2

Students will investigate different versions of popular fairy tales. We will explore them through literature, arts and crafts, and movies clips.

Dinos, Fossils, and Mammoths (Grades 1-3) Mrs. Maria Contreras

Period 5: 1:00 pm – 2:00 pm . Session 2

We will take a look back on earth when dinosaurs roamed the land. Through science, reading, and art, we will explore dinosaurs and prehistoric times.



Reading Comprehension Strategies & Writing Skills (Grades 3-4) Mrs. Nicole Smiland

Period 1: 8:00 am- 9:00 am . Sessions 1 & 2

Period 3: 10:15 am – 11:15 am . Sessions 1 & 2

This class will focus on enhancing the reading and writing skills of incoming 3 and 4th graders. Students will practice using reading comprehension techniques and strategies to become more active and engaged readers. They will be shown how to use text evidence to support their responses to literature and nonfiction texts and will practice responding to a variety of passages. During the writing component of the class, students will be introduced to strategies and techniques to help them produce organized paragraphs and essays.

Math Concepts & Drills (Grades 3-4) Mrs. Nicole Smiland

Period 2: 9:00 am- 10:00 am . Sessions 1 & 2

Period 4: 12:00 pm – 1:00 pm . Sessions 1 & 2

This class will help students strengthen a range of math skills in a fun and relaxed environment. Hands-on math instruction and manipulatives will be used to review fundamental concepts including multiplication, division, fractions, and geometry. Students will also be introduced to games to help with math fact and computation practice.

Hands on Science (Grades 3-5) Mrs. Nicole Smiland

Period 5: 1:00 pm – 2:00 pm . Sessions 1 & 2

Students will explore Physical and Earth science through fun and challenging hands-on activities. They will use the steps of the Scientific Method to investigate Rocks and Minerals and Magnets and Electricity.



Fifth Grade Reading (Grade 5) Mrs. Aubrey Moeller

Period 1: 8:00 am- 9:00 am . Sessions 1 & 2

In this course, students will continue to build their reading concepts. Students will read their assigned summer reading book and will continue to grow their vocabulary and strengthen their summarizing skills.

Fifth Grade Math (Grade 5) Mrs. Aubrey Moeller

Period 2: 9:00 am- 10:00 am . Sessions 1 & 2

In this course students will strengthen their math skills through hands-on learning and games. Students will also be working on their summer math requirement.



Fifth Grade Writing (Grade 5) Mrs. Aubrey Moeller

Period 3: 10:15 am – 11:15 am . Sessions 1 & 2

In this course students will write, share, and learn different techniques to be effective writers.

Around the World in Eight Days (Grades 4-5) Mrs. Aubrey Moeller

Period 4: 12:00 pm – 1:00 pm . Sessions 1 & 2

In this elective class, students will be learning about different cultures from around the world, enhancing their knowledge of world geography, and doing hands-on activities to learn about the world around them.

Comic Books and Cartooning (Grades 4-5) Mrs. Aubrey Moeller

Period 5: 1:00 pm – 2:00 pm . Sessions 1 & 2

Do you enjoy reading and making comics? Then this class is for you! Bring your own cartoon characters to life! You will learn how to draw funny faces, animals, and some of your favorite characters that you enjoy reading about. You will then create your own story strips. Let your imagination take over.

Fitness, Nutrition and Mental Health (Grades 3-5) Mrs. Cindy Herrera

Period 1: 8:00 am- 9:00 am . Session 2

Students will learn a few exercises to keep them going, even on the days when they're not feeling it. This class will be a combination of physical education and learning how to properly stretch before and after exercising; as well as cooking fun and easy items so keep them emotionally and physically energized.

Hands-on Science (Grades 3-5) Mrs. Cindy Herrera

Period 2: 9:00 am- 10:00 am . Session 2

For this class, children will become scientists and experiment in a variety of ways according to the Next Generation Science standards. As scientists, they will be exposed to STEM activities that will engage them and have them excited about science. These young scientists will be working with plants, and learning more about the planetary system, the Earth's atmosphere, and ecosystems.

Arts and Crafts (Grades 3-5) Mrs. Cindy Herrera

Period 3: 10:15 am – 11:15 am . Session 2

Kids will get to learn how to create creatively fun crafts: kindness rocks, photo frames, water bottle piggy banks, etc.

Study Skills (Grades 3-5) Mrs. Cindy Herrera

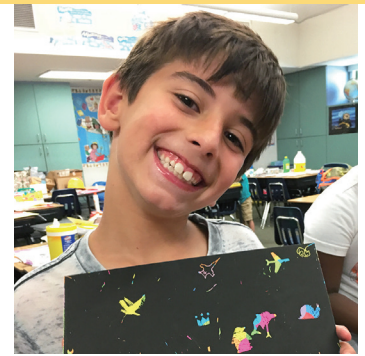
Period 4: 12:00 pm – 1:00 pm . Session 2

Students will learn about sea creatures and the unknowns of our world's ocean, which is larger than we actually think!

Period 2: 9:00 am- 10:00 am . Sessions 1 & 2

This course will consist of activities that will provide learning experiences in a variety of team sports. Emphasis is placed on the development of competency through the mastery of more complex movement. Period 1: 8:00 am- 9:00 am . Sessions 1 & 2

Come along and explore the world of technology through computers and iPads! We will discover the many software programs, applications, and websites available to elementary students. We will learn basic coding, typing, and other technology tools that students can use to improve organization and study skills that support academic achievement. If you love technology and learning new things, this class is for you! Computers and iPads will be provided to use during class time.

Fun with Technology (Grades 3-5) Ms. Juaneeq Elliott

Period 2: 9:00 am- 10:00 am . Sessions 1 & 2

Period 3: 10:15 am – 11:15 am . Sessions 1 & 2

Students will explore the newest and coolest Web tools of today! We will use iPads to take pictures and videos that will later be uploaded and edited for the use in student projects. They will become familiar with editing, typing, coding, basic Microsoft and iPad training/techniques, and iMovie tutorials. Students will create their own interactive videos and animations. Along the way, we will create daily projects, while learning to tell stories in a fun and unique way! If you enjoy using technology and want to learn about some of the newest tools on the web, come and have some "Fun with Technology." Computers and iPads will be provided to use during class time.





Spanish (Kindergarten; Grades 1-2; Grades 3-5) Maestra Aceves

Period 2: 9:00 am- 10:00 am . Sessions 1 & 2 (Grades 3-5)

Period 3: 10:15 am – 11:15 am . Sessions 1 & 2 (Grades 1-2)

Period 4: 12:00 pm – 1:00 pm . Sessions 1 & 2 (Kindergarten)

Kindergarten, first and second grade students will learn Spanish in fun and interactive ways through storytelling, music, and games. Students will learn greetings, the alphabet, and numbers. Third through fifth grade students will learn formal and informal greetings, how to describe themselves and others, and express likes and dislikes. All levels of Spanish classes will allow students opportunities to explore Latin American culture through art and music.



Handwriting Without Tears (Kindergarten; Grade 1) Ms. Christine Ward

Period 5: 1:00 pm – 2:00 pm . Sessions 1 & 2 (Kindergarten)

Your child will engage in Kindergarten writing readiness by playing, singing, and building letters, through multisensory teaching, movement, and memory, addressing all learning styles. Children move, touch, feel, and manipulate real objects as they learn the habits and skills essential for writing. The course also uses music to speak to children. Kindergarten students develop the important skills they need to print words, sentences, and paragraphs. Lessons address grip, letter and number recognition and formation, capitals first and then lowercase letters, and line generalization. This course is lefty friendly and promotes left-to-right directionality.

Period 4: 12:00 pm – 1:00 pm . Sessions 1 & 2 (Grade 1)

In first grade, children develop strong printing skills with hands-on activities and lessons that integrate important language arts skills, including sentence, word, and paragraph composition. Teaching letters in a developmental order helps children master skills, learning, good habits, and boosts confidence promoting quick success.

Visual Art (Grades K-2; Grades 3-5) Ms. Erin Arnold

Period 5: 1:00 pm – 2:00 pm . Sessions 1 & 2 (Grades K-2)

In this course, kindergarten through second grader students will explore various visual arts media, including watercolor, pastels, tempera paints, clay and papier mâché. They will have fun learning a variety of art techniques and expressing their God-given creativity.

Period 4: 12:00 pm – 1:00 pm . Sessions 1 & 2 (Grades 3-5)

This course will allow third through fifth grade students many opportunities for creative expression and exploration through visual art media. Students will develop drawing and painting techniques through the study of line, space, value, color, form, and composition. Incorporation of digital tools including iPads, printers and projectors will enhance students' creative image-making.

Poetry Slam (Grades 5-8) Mrs. Stefanie Lutero

Period 4: 12:00 pm – 1:00 pm . Sessions 1 & 2

Would you love to learn to write and perform slam poetry? In this course, you will explore age-appropriate slam poetry and learn methods of writing your own expressive pieces. You will also have opportunities to perform your original works for your class peers and receive thoughtful and encouraging feedback.

Greek and Roman Mythology (Grades 5-8) Mrs. Stefanie Lutero

Period 5: 1:00 pm – 2:00 pm . Sessions 1 & 2

Dive into the worlds of Greek and Roman gods, goddesses, heroes, and monsters. Students will engage in a study of classic stories, as well as participate in art related projects, games, and interactive projects which bring this history alive!



Intro to 6th Grade Math (Grade 6) Mrs. Francesca Smiland

Period 1: 8:00 am- 9:00 am . Sessions 1 & 2

Preview the 6th grade math curriculum in a fun, low-pressure atmosphere. Students will begin exploring algebraic reasoning with a beginner's approach to solving one and two-step equations. In week two, students will dive deep into understanding integers and integer operations. In week three, students will review and reinforce their understanding of fraction operations. The last week, students will take a hands-on approach to understanding geometric figures. All lessons will include real-world application and a teacher-directed approach to word problems. Your student will enter sixth-grade with math confidence ready to tackle middle school!

Intro to Algebra 1 (Grades 7-8) Mrs. Francesca Smiland

Period 2: 9:00 am- 10:00 am . Sessions 1 & 2

Begin exploring the concepts of Algebra 1. Algebra 1 is taught at the eighth-grade level and can be a big jump for students conceptually. In this class, students will preview Algebra concepts in a fun, low-pressure atmosphere. Week one will include solving single and multistep equations and inequalities. In week two, students will cover all concepts related to graphing linear equations. In week three, students will combine these concepts and learn how to solve two equations in two variables. Finally, in week four, students will apply their knowledge by solving real world application problems in the form of extensive word problems. Your student will enter eighth-grade with the math confidence to tackle Algebra 1!



High School Placement Test (HSPT) Math (Grades 7-8) Mrs. Francesca Smiland

Period 3: 10:15 am – 11:15 am . Sessions 1 & 2

Getting ready to apply to a Catholic high school? Are your quantitative and math skills a little rusty? Practice and preview the concepts on which you will be tested when you take the HSPT. This class will include three practice classes a week in which students will be doing teacher directed exercises to get prepared for the HSPT. Every Thursday, we will take a practice test on a math section of the HSPT. Students will gain exposure to the test and confidence in their skills.

Science Laboratory (Grades 5-6) Mrs. Francesca Smiland

Period 4: 12:00 pm – 1:00 pm . Sessions 1 & 2

Get your hands dirty while exploring our scientific world! Students will use the scientific method to perform lab activities in which they will collect qualitative and quantitative data. This class is strictly the activity component of a science lab; it will be fun, informative, and best of all, hands-on!

Science Writing Component (must take Science Laboratory class) (Grades 5-6) Mrs. Francesca Smiland

Period 5: 1:00 pm – 2:00 pm . Sessions 1 & 2

Learn how to write up your science findings in a neat and organized report. Students will predict, report, analyze and conclude. In the analyze and conclude portion, students will use the Jane Schaffer writing method to present their conclusions with clear concrete details and examples. By the end of the summer, students will understand how to write about science!

Lunch and Snack

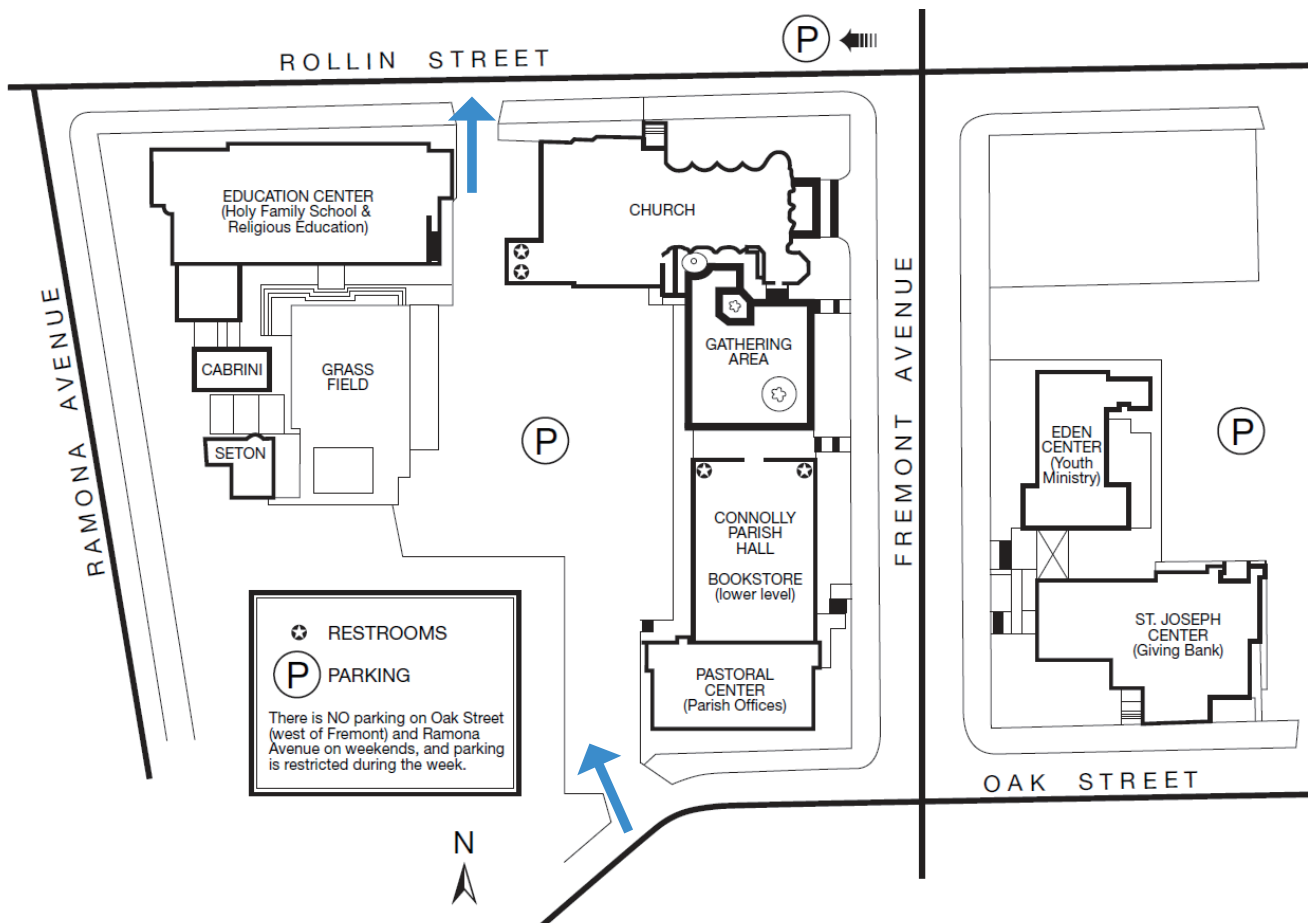
Lunches and snacks are not provided. Students should bring a lunch and snack to school each day.
