Fundraising, Scrip, and Legacy of Learning—What's the difference and where does it go???

he Parent Guild pledges approximately \$43,000 annually to the schools operating budget. The school counts on this money to continue to provide programs and staff for our children. Additionally approximately \$15,000 annually used to fund school and faculty events run by the Parent Guild throughout the year. Some of the programs include; new family welcome meeting and reception, faculty Christmas bonuses on behalf of all the parents, the spirituality program, Jog-a-thon t-shirts, kindergarten and 8th grade graduation receptions, 8th grade graduation gifts, 8th grade scholarships, the faculty appreciation and Christmas luncheons and more.

Parent Guild funds are acquired through your participation in fundraising events. Profits from our fall fundraiser, Great American, contribute approximately \$14,000. Profits from our spring fundraiser, Jog-a-thon, contribute approximately \$39,000. The balance is made up through smaller additional fundraisers throughout the year (Menchie's, Dog Haus, Carb Night...), fundraising buy-outs, and end of year service hours. We as families here at HFS have committed to participate in fundraising. Each family is required to fulfill a commitment of \$240/family annually. Thanks to our fabulous event chairs (Kim Erikson and Maria Risher for Great American and Gail Hermano and Dana Negro for Jog-a-thon) we will meet our commitments again this year. The hard work and dedication these ladies provided has been extraordinary.

In addition, each family has a Scrip profit commitment of \$240. The Scrip profits do not flow into the Parent Guild budget, 100% of the profits go directly to the school. Thanks to Dianne Ciulla for leading Scrip for now the tenth year in a row.

Legacy of Learning is the school's annual giving program that is completely separate from our Parent Guild fundraising commitments. Legacy provides additional funding over and above our Parent Guild commitments and is part of the school's operating budget.

We have limited the number of fundraisers this year so that we aren't overwhelming you. Our goal is to make it easy for families to participate in our smaller fundraisers. This year's introduction of Food Truck Night was a big success.

Thank you again for making our fundraising commitments work for the school and for making our school an amazing place to send our children.

n behalf of City of Hope please accept our thanks for sponsoring a City of Hope blood drive on Wednesday February 6, 2013! Without sponsors like you, we would not be able to reach our monthly hospital collection needs for our patients.

Through the generosity, time and commitment of you and your members we were able to collect 29 units of life-saving blood. Monthly our patient's blood usage goes up but our blood drive calendar continues to be unfilled. Your wonderful blood drive came at an opportune time. Team, having been able to collect these units at Holy Family Church and School and not having to purchase those from another blood collection source such as the American Red Cross gave City of Hope a savings of \$9,135.00 in blood purchases from your event alone. This savings can go to use to future cancer research.

As you may know, here at City of Hope we use more than 2,700 units of blood and platelets a month for our patients. All blood collected by our staff stays at our hospital for the needs of our City of Hope patients. We look forward to working with you again in the future and hope you and your team decided to become a regular "Partner in Hope" with our program.


