Holy Family continues to be a place where our visions of how we live the Gospel become reality.



After a nine-month search, we are delighted to introduce Darcie Girmus as our new Principal for the upcoming school year 2019.

Darcie comes to Holy Family with over 32 years of experience as an educator: 16 years in Catholic education and 6 years as Principal. She has a Masters of Arts in Catholic School Leadership and a Masters of Arts in Curriculum and Instruction. For the past 6



years, Darcie has served as the Principal of St. Mark Catholic School in Vienna, Virginia, where she also worked as Assistant Principal and Teacher. Darcie's development of a program of academic excellence at St. Mark's and her passion for serving children and working with teachers and parents make her a perfect fit for our community. Her commitment to strong leadership, quality instruction and devotion to her faith will serve her well here at Holy Family School.

Our job to find a new principal began in May 2018. We launched the process with a series of stakeholder meetings with faculty, staff, and parents to identify the priorities for the new principal. The ideal candidate should be an educational leader, a spiritual leader and an effective communicator with the entire community. Working collaboratively with the Archdiocese of Los Angeles, the Search Committee reviewed over 30 resumes, participated in over 70 interview hours by phone and in person with a dozen candidates, and hosted our finalist for a 2 ½ day on-campus visit.

We are deeply grateful to our Search Committee for their dedication and hard work, and especially to Mimi Butler, our Chair, and Michelle Bonoan, who took on the task of conducting the preliminary phone interviews.

2019 PADDLE RAISE

CUTTING EDGE E-LIBRARY AND SUMMER SCHOOL SCHOLARSHIPS

This year, Holy Family raised funds to implement a cutting-edge "e-library" that will be a shared resource with Our Lady of Guadalupe and Dolores Mission Schools, impacting hundreds of children in our greater community. Access to books remains at the core of a child's education and the single most significant factor influencing a child's early educational success. According to the US Department of Education, children who are read to at least three times a week are almost twice as likely to score in the top 25% on academic testing compared to children who read less than 3 times a week. However, 60% of low-income students are still growing up without books in their home.

In an effort to keep libraries current, we are now able to create a steady stream of new, age-appropriate books, which has been shown to nearly triple a student's interest in reading. Incorporating an e-library not only allows us to add hundreds of new titles and databases on our own campus, but also share these unlimited book titles digitally with our sister-schools at no additional cost beyond the initial equipment purchase. This opportunity truly helps us live our faith as a Catholic community of disciples of Jesus Christ, reaching out to Dolores Mission and OLG Schools as well, and providing them with enhanced learning opportunities. Further, the e-library will enhance community summer and after-school enrichment programs through the addition of science, coding, multi-media music and STEAM maker-space programming kits. Finally, we also raised important funds for 20 summer school scholarships so that students from Dolores Mission and OLG Schools can also benefit from the extraordinary summer school experience at Holy Family.

GRANT HIGHLIGHTS

GARDEN & LANDSCAPE GRANT SUPPORT

Over the past year, Holy Family School secured grants to improve our Outdoor Learning Center and Garden Program. The key benefits of the Holy Family School garden program are educational applications, nutrition and wellness, environmental awareness, community building and social connectedness. The expansion of our garden program has been funded by grants from Enrich LA, the Whole Kids Foundation, California Foundation for Agriculture and Water Education Foundation. Grants supporting school nutrition were provided by the Action for Healthy Kids and Fuel Up to Play Foundations.

Additional shade coverage for outdoor learning was funded by the American Academy of Dermatology Foundation. Nurse Jackie Ficht and the Holy Family School students created a winning skin safety video that achieved the \$10,000 first place prize in the American Academy of Dermatology competition.

An ongoing design grant from the Native Garden Foundation, including funding and a landscape design for Holy Family School and Parish, is currently being implemented in phases. The goal of the landscape

design is site-wide drought-tolerant landscaping connected to the curriculum.

A significant grant from The Raskob Foundation has been applied to landscape expansion related to service-learning and food production for the Holy Family Giving Bank. The grant from The Raskob Foundation has given Holy Family the tools to be a pilot school that will work with partners to design and implement a model Catholic Urban Farming Initiative to be replicated in schools and parishes throughout the Archdiocese. The initiative is a collaborative effort with the Archdiocese of Los Angeles and Catholic Relief Services to integrate cross-curricular urban farming lessons as a means of supporting service-learning in our Catholic Schools. In addition to providing hands-on opportunities to enhance the curriculum, the initiative provides surplus food production for our parish Giving Bank. As students learn more about growing food for those in need, they are connecting the growing process to food insecurity that exists in their own community and discovering they can make a difference. We look forward to watching the garden and landscape projects grow and flourish at Holy Family.


