
REGISTRATION

- Registration deadline is April 30, 2017
- Enrollment during registration is on a first-come first-served basis
- Classes close when they reach maximum enrollment
- Students may enroll in 1-3 courses
- Please be sure students are enrolled in consecutive classes when registering for more than one period
- Grade level refers to the grade student will be entering Fall 2017

TUITION AND FEES

- Tuition is \$250 per 4-week course (Includes materials)

Period One Courses

8:30 am - 10:00 am, Mondays - Thursdays, June 26-July 20, 2017

Kindergarten Readiness (to cover periods one and two) Mrs. Brenda Ascencio and Mrs. Heidi Sicka

Grade



Kindergarten Readiness Program will provide students with the opportunity to receive support in making the transition from preschool to Kindergarten. Throughout this course, the students will participate in activities that will help foster the academic skills necessary for a successful experience in Kindergarten. The key components that will be focused on are social development, phonological awareness, print knowledge, mathematics, and science. This course also provides the students with opportunities to get accustomed to the Kindergarten routines and expectations.

Math and Language Arts Proficiency (Grades 1 and 2) Ms. Carrie Levin

Grades

1-2

This proficiency course will focus on the academic skills within the subjects of math and language arts. In mathematics, the students will focus on place, value, learning strategies of addition and subtraction (sharpening their basic facts skills!), introduction to word problems, and many more topics. In language arts, the students will work on their reading skills, phonics, reading comprehension, and creative writing. This course will be a great chance to sharpen their skills, review concepts, and get a little jumpstart on their new grade level work!

Math and Language Arts Proficiency (Grades 3 and 4) Ms. Cindy Herrera

Grades

3-4

For mathematics, students will be learning different strategies to support them with Common Core Math Standard algorithms. Utilizing a Cognitively-Guided Instruction (CGI) approach, students will utilize given resources to learn how to break down numbers via multiplication and division equations. Students will also be exposed to extensive real life word problems that will engage them with the application of these strategies to better their understanding that there are different ways to get to an answer. This will eventually lead them to master standard algorithms. For language arts, students will be challenged to create their own narratives, and become exposed to expository writing. They will also be revising their own work to help them understand the mechanics or grammar of the English language.

Reading and Writing Proficiency (Grade 5) Mr. Joseph Gerpe

Grade

5

This course is designed to evaluate the level of the students' reading and writing abilities in relation to the requirements set down by the California State Standards. The children will be required to demonstrate the skills needed to excel in the core subject of English Language Arts. These skills include, but are not limited to, reading comprehension, text analysis, and writing production and distribution.



Period One Courses

Visual Art (Grades 3-5) Ms. Erin Arnold

This course will allow students many opportunities for creative expression and exploration through visual art media. Plots, Props, and Perfomance! (Grades 1-3) Ms. Carrie Levin

Grades

1-3

This course will provide students the opportunity to improve reading fluency and comprehension through dramatic presentation of written work in script form. Reader's Theater will help the children to explore reading through their voice, imagination, facial expressions, and creativity. They will bring the stories to life through body movement, prop building and costume making (both with paper and arts and crafts materials). Reader's Theater Scripts are adapted from grade level books and other sources, giving the students essential practice in oral reading fluency and public speaking. The scripts also provide an opportunity for group interaction and student cooperation. Come and let your acting bug shine in this very interactive Reader's Theater course.

Art (Grades 1-3) Ms. Sandra Arevalo

1-3

Students will be learning the elements of art while learning vocabulary that is meaningful, useful and fun. Students will have hands-on experiences on the elements that will enhance their creativity.

Hands on Science (Grades 1-3) Ms. Cindy Herrera

Grades

1-3

For this class, children will become scientists and experiment in a variety of ways according to the Next Generation Science standards. As scientists, they will be exposed to STEM activities that will engage them and have them excited about science. These young scientists will be working with plants, and learning more about the planetary system, the Earth's atmosphere and ecosystems.



Period Two Courses

10:15 am - 11:45 am, Mondays - Thursdays, June 26-July 20, 2017

Reader's Theater (Grades 4-5) Mr. Joseph Gerpe

This course is designed to practice and increase students' reading fluency through interactive analyzation and individually-established interpretation. Rather than simply reciting words from a text, Readers Theater requires the children to explore the story using their voice, facial expressions, and other forms of body language to develop empathy and understanding. Reading is no longer about the words on the page but about the meaning of the narrative through the eyes of the characters.

Visual Art (Grades 4-5) Ms. Erin Arnold

This course will allow students many opportunities for creative expression and exploration through visual art media. Students will develop drawing and painting techniques through the study of line, space, value, color, form and composition. Incorporation of digital tools including iPads, deskop computers, printers and projectors will enhance students' creative image-making.

Tech 101 (Grades K-2) Mrs. Brenda Ascencio



This course will introduce young students to the amazing world of technology. In a safe and supervised environment, students will explore and create digital content using both iPads and 3-D printers.

Science with a Bang! (Grades K-2) Ms. Heidi Sicka



In order to learn about the world in which they live, children must be given the opportunities to discover the physical properties of objects around them. Our young scientists will be motivated to explore their environment and encouraged to ask how and why things happen while engaging in the process of science. Scientist will learn about science safety, key words and the concept of the day such as air, water, gadgets, and concoctions with take-home projects and daily experiments. Each day, scientists will record their experiences in a journal that will go home with them at the end of the session.

Art (Grades K-2) Ms. Cindy Herrera



As young artists, students will learn how to portray their emotions through art. They will also be exposed to geometric shapes, and how to create art through these shapes. Students will learn how primary colors can be combined to create a wide variety of distinct colors. Students will be able to utilize common items to apply a 3-Dimensional element to their created works of art.


Behavior
